1	<p align="center"><b>Gosport Street Pastors</b></p> <p>This project is run by a local management team under the license from The Ascension Trust, a registered charity. Volunteers from Gosport churches, go out in groups onto the High Street and surrounding areas from 22:30 until 03:00 hours, on Friday and Saturday nights. There are currently thirty-three street pastors and their mandate is to listen, care and help those who are vulnerable. <b>The additional funding will train and equip a further four street pastors.</b></p>	£1000	Chris Cooper
2	<p><b>'Lighten Up' - Dolphin Crescent &amp; Alverbridge View Residents Association</b></p> <p>This group is seeking funds for additional street lighting at the entrance to Gosport Park and Dolphin Crescent, to improve feelings of safety for all members of the public visiting the area. <b>The funds will cover the cost of implementing two lighting columns.</b></p>	£1200	Anthony Frasle

4	<p align="center"><b>'Take Off' with choices and wellbeing</b></p> <p>Choices and Wellbeing is a course using a form of Cognitive Behavioural Therapy. The project aims to recruit ten candidates, who are at risk of offending via local contacts, including Hampshire Constabulary, Housing and other support agencies. The course will be delivered at Seafeld Community House, Old Road. Weekly 'opportunities workshops ' and follow up support will be provided for six months with one to one coaching and life planning guidance. The impact of this project is to transform young 'potential' offenders and people on probation within the town ward to give them the opportunity of choices. <b>The funding applied for will pay for delivery of the training, venue hire and promotional materials.</b></p>	£6532	Christie Breen
5	<p align="center"><b>'Transformer Awareness Campaign' - Transformer</b></p> <p>This group meets every Saturday and offers a safe and friendly environment for people who are living with the addiction to or misuse of harmful substances such as alcohol, drugs or prescription medicines. <b>The funds applied for will be used for additional promotional material and venue hire costs to enable the Group to extend the offer of support to a much higher number of people within the Town, Anglesey and Christchurch Wards.</b></p>	£500	Alan Butcher Mr. David Clodfelter

7	<p><b>Gosport Children's Contact Centre</b></p> <p>This project is applying for funding to deliver a Domestic Abuse Reduction Programme. 9	<p><b>'Gosport Youth Leaders'</b></p> <p>This project aims to provide activities, qualifications and other opportunities to young people aged between 14-24 years old. These young leaders gain experience and good quality training for free in any sport, play, childcare, youth or voluntary opportunity.
